ABOUT THE PLAYWRIGHT

SAM SHEPARD skyrocketed to fame in the '60's as an avante-garde off-off Broadway playwright. In 1975 he became (and still is) a resident playwright at San Francisco 's Magic Theater, creating such masterpieces as *Curse of the Starving Class, Buried Child* (Pulitzer Prize, 1979), *True West,* and *Fool for Love*. He wrote *Paris, Texas* which won Best Picture, Cannes Film Festival, 1984. His film acting credits include *The Right Stuff* (Oscar nomination), *Resurrection, Days of Heaven,* and *Frances*.

DIRECTOR'S NOTES

best read after the play

I had never seen or read *True West* until last summer when I was contemplating asking Actors Ensemble if I could direct this season. My gut reaction to the play was negative. I thought it was too gratuitously violent, both psychologically and physically. I don't like most Martin Scorsese films for the same reason. Then I wondered if the reading had impacted me so much, maybe I should examine what power it had over me. I realized the psychological sadism was an influence of plays of Harold Pinter, a writer I much admire. The bizarre humor of *True West* is rooted in so much pain – I grew up in an alcoholic household as did Sam Shepard, and it affects me today as it does him. So I accepted the invitation of the play to look at my shadow side. On a cultural level, Shepard uses the play's title to suggest that our romanticized ideas of the Old West, of rugged male individualism and isolationism, have created chaos in our individual and collective American psyches. Also there exists the delusion we can achieve happiness by having the right things, "...the wife, and kiddies...the house, the car, the whole slam...", as Lee puts it. The feminist movement highlighted the plight of the woman in American culture, and Sam Shepard in *True West* dramatizes the less discussed but no less real spiritual angst of the American male.

CAST AND CREW

ALAN BARKAN (Stage Manager) attended the American Academy of Dramatic Arts and American Mime Theatre School in New York. He was the assistant stage manager at Mineola Theatre and tech directory for the Westbury Music Fair, both on Long Island. Alan was artist-in-residence for The Goddard Summer Repertory Theater and a teaching fellow in theatre at Goddard College in Vermont. He performed in *The Knack, Three Penny Opera, The Laundry, Criminals, Fantastics, Dylan* and a number of children's theater productions. He directed *Precious Moments from the Family Album to Provide You with Comfort in the Long Years to Come* and co-directed *Dylan*. True West is Alan Barkan's return to theater after 33 years.

BEN GRUBB (Lee) is making his first appearance in the Bay Area in *True West*. Other notable work includes *Carpenter in Blue Collar Work* at the Chicago Festival of the Arts, Prospero in *The Tempest*, Billy in *Billy Bishop Goes to War*, and Paul in *Pants Off* at the Present Company in New York. A graduate from Oberlin College's theater program, Ben lives in Oakland and would like to thank Josh Robinson and Abby Enscoe for their support.

FREDERICK CHANG'S (Photographer) photographic career began in a small campus darkroom, where he diligently printed his documentary "Berkeley" through the late hours of the night. As a senior at school, Fred won first place in the university-wide Lyon Prize Photography Competition. Since then, "Berkeley" has been chosen by renowned curators, such as those of the Whitney Museum of American Art and the SFMOMA Artist Gallery, for exhibition at galleries and museums throughout the country, including most recently the Palm Springs Art Museum. Besides photography, Fred enjoys making robots that traverse intricate mazes at lightning-speeds and is always on the look-out for the perfectly resonant audio amplifier to highlight his well-selected music collection.

JAY KIECOLT-WAHL (Austin) was born in Evanston, Illinois and graduated from Northwestern University, where he studied theatre and mathematics, before moving to the Bay Area over two years ago. In Chicago, he has performed at Shattered Globe Theatre, Bailiwick Repertory, American Theatre Company (formerly American Blues Theatre), and Steppenwolf. Jay is currently studying acting with Andrew Utter in San Francisco. This is for his brother.

JOSE GARCIA (Assistant Stage Manager) is a native of the Bay Area and grew up in Berkeley. This is his first time working in a production at Actors Ensemble. He previously appeared as an Officer/Jailer in *The Comedy of Errors* at the Orinda Starlight Theatre.

JOHN HURST (Saul) is a member of the Marin Actors workshop, where he recently enacted the role of the fool in *King Lear*. In addition to this role he has worked with the San Francisco mime troupe as a summer intern, enacted the role of Neil at the Belrose Theater and has acted with a variety of theater companies in Boston, Massachusetts. A long time admirer of Sam Shepard's work, he is delighted to enact the role of Saul Kimmer and look forward to doing more of the author's works. When not working on a theatrical project, Mr. Hurst can be found counseling individuals with severe mental illness. He acknowledges being a political junkie and has been known to attend baseball games during his days off.

KEVIN FLETCHER TWEEDY (Composer) collaborated with Paul Shepard on various projects at U.C. including music for *Merry Wives of Windsor* and Henry Fielding's *Tom Thumb*. Originally a music major in college, Kevin switched to computing, founding a software company which went public in 2000. Kevin now works solely in composing, arranging, performing and producing music for film, television, theatre and commercials. MAUREEN COYNE (Mom) is a former member of the One Act Theatre of San Francisco, where she has worked with many theatres in the Bay Area. Last spring, she played Costanza, the Italian servant, in *Enchanted April* at the Douglas Morrisson Theatre in Hayward. This past summer, she was Elizabeth, the memoir writer, in *The Act of Dining* at the Dragon Theatre in Palo Alto. Recent credits with AE include Edna in *A Delicate Balance;* Monica, the secretary, in *Present Laughter;* and just last fall, Miss Tesman in *Hedda Gabler.*

PAUL SHEPARD (Director) worked as an Educational TV Producer/Director at Cal, where he received a Ph.D. in Dramatic Art, and directed over two hundred video productions, including a dozen Shakespearean plays. His work has been broadcast on cable and been distributed internationally. He was awarded the Chancellor's Distinguished Service Award. Additionally, he has directed thirty stage plays, and performed in both regional theatre and an NPR satire group, *World In Your Face*.

SHU PING GUAN (Backdrop Artist, Props) works as a production artist and freelance designer. She studied architecture, but doesn't plan on being an architect. Her previous work with Actors Ensemble was in last fall's production of *Hedda Gabler*, where she assisted in props, set, and costumes.

LYSISTRATA

COMING IN APRIL

Part of the 2002 worldwide Lysistrata Project, Ellen McLaughlin's humorous interpretation of the Aristophane's classic, *Lysistrata*, tells the story of women from opposing Greek states who unite to end a war by refusing to sleep with their husbands. Powerless in their society, the women take the only tactic available to them—they withhold sex.

Ellen McLaughlin's plays, including *Infinity's House, Iphigenia and Other Daughters, Tongue of a Bird, The Trojan Women, Helen, The Persians* and *Oedipus,* have received numerous national and international productions. McLaughlin is also an actor most well

known for having originated the part of the Angel in Tony Kushner's *Angels in America*, appearing in every U.S. production from its earliest workshops through its Broadway run.
