A Note from the Director:

When I was in my teens, one of my best friends worked at the Mineola Theatre on Long Island, N.Y., at the time (in the '60's) one of the few year-round legitimate theaters on the island. I hung out there with him, a lot. That's where I met LUV. On many levels, I was too young to appreciate it. Time certainly has remedied that.

When asked what I'd like to direct for AE's 2009 season, LUV immediately came to mind. I got it. I understood how bad we could be at loving and being loved.

Then I learned that Murray Schisgal, the author of LUV, was also the cowriter of the screenplay for the movie "Tootsie." Who knows why our minds take these foolish leaps, but leap mine did. Bringing us to here, three versions of LUV - straight, lesbian and gay.

But to get to here, Mr. Schisgal's permission was needed. Initially, my request to change the gender of the characters was denied by Dramatist Play Service (they handle use rights). To which I responded, "Surely the co-author of Tootsie would not have issues with gender bending." So I appealed to Mr. Schisgal's agent who passed it on to Mr. Schisgal. I was so pleased to learn I was correct - Mr. Schisgal did not have issues with gender bending. Thank you Mr. Schisgal.

Back to the leap. I tend to get disturbed by our need as humans to label our differences and then use the labels to be separated. Regardless of how we choose to label ourselves or how others choose to label us, we all draw from the same wells of need, desire, caring and fear. It's all real and it doesn't matter if you call it love or luv.

I encourage you to see all three stagings of LUV.
