

ABOUT THE PLAYWRIGHTS

Named among Time magazine's "100 Innovators for the Next Wave," **Suzan-Lori Parks** is one of the most acclaimed playwrights in American drama today. She is the first African-American woman to receive the Pulitzer Prize in Drama, is a MacArthur "Genius" Award recipient, and in 2015 was awarded the prestigious Gish Prize for Excellence in the Arts. Parks' project 365 Days/365 Plays (where she wrote a play a day for an entire year) was produced in over 700 theaters worldwide, creating one of the largest grassroots collaborations in theater history.



Her other plays include: Topdog/Underdog (2002 Pulitzer Prize winner); The Book of Grace; Unchain My Heart: The Ray Charles Musical: In the Blood (2000) Pulitzer Prize finalist): Imperceptible Mutabilities in the Third Kingdom (1990 OBIE Award, Best New American Play); The America Play and Fucking A. Her adaptation of The Gershwin's Porgy and Bess won the 2012 Tony Award for Best Revival of a Musical. Her newest plays, Father Comes Home

From The Wars (Parts 1, 2 & 3)—set during the Civil War, was a 2015 Pulitzer Prize Finalist.



Carol Lashof makes plays to change the stories we believe in because it's the best way she knows to change the world we live in. Her work has been broadcast on BET (*Gap*, dir. Ryan Coogler) and NPR (*The Story*, dir. Martin Esslin) and staged on five continents from The Magic Theatre of San Francisco to Peking University in Beijing. Carol is Professor Emerita at

Susannah Wood (Director) has been active as a professional actress and singer for many years, in the Bay Area and beyond. She has directed over 50 classic and new plays for **Actors Ensemble**, <u>Crowden Summer Opera</u> and <u>Opera Piccola</u> ("Small Works"). She is excited about collaborating on plays whose themes creatively parallel Wilder's **The Skin of Our Teeth**.

Director's Note: Although these plays seem completely different, I chose them because they address a question that is central in **Actors Ensemble's** current main stage production: how does our planet survive its troubles?

Like **The Skin of Our Teeth**, both **Persephone Underground** and **365/365**, touch on politics, the environment, war, human folly and social justice. I love how these three writers – Thornton Wilder, Suzan-Lori Parks and Carol Lashof- express the struggles of humanity in such completely different and exciting ways.
