### A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR

This Invalid journey started in December 2019, when I decided to revisit The Imaginary Invalid as a possible production for our 2020 summer season. I enjoy Molière's commedia dell'arte style of comedic satire. After rereading it I remembered why I enjoyed the play and also why I had never considered it for a production previously. The original (translated) script is a meandering 4 hour loquacious piece clunking along with pages upon pages of rambling monologues against medicine, ballet and music interludes, and many inconsequential one page characters.

Yet at its heart is a quick witted little physical comedy experience. With an election year just around the corner where health care for all would be a hot button issue, I saw the opportunity to tame Molière's Invalid into a quick comedy lightly nodding to the importance of universal access to healthcare. So off I went adapting, little did I know what lay ahead in 2020.

For obvious reasons we were unable to perform live in the John Hinkel Park amphitheater this summer (ahem... Covid). So the new hurdle became, how to perform comedy that is mostly physical on the zoom screen. What it took was a talented and committed cast coming together and figuring out creative ways to energize and work the camera. It has been a wonderful learning experience where the limitations of tech and budget lead to wonderful creativity and stretched our view of art.


