A Note from the Director

Cymbeline is one of Shakespeare's lesser-known works. It belongs to his later period, along with *The Winter's Tale, Measure for Measure*, and *The Tempest*. He was no longer writing dramatic histories. He was done with merry comedies about love and marriage. He'd had enough of terrible tragedies centered on flawed titanic figures. He was just writing great plays and letting them go to where they needed to be. To aficionados familiar with the entire canon, *Cymbeline* is very often a favorite. Its language is intricate; its imagery is vivid. Its characters are recognizably and thoroughly human.

The setup couldn't be simpler. The place is ancient Britain, two thousand years ago, under Roman domination. A princess has married a "poor but worthy gentleman." She has a scheming stepmother. The new Queen wants to set the princess up with her brutish son and control "the placing of the British crown." The King banishes the husband. The Princess goes on a quest to find her lost love.

But what happens after that becomes a kind of strange loop, two figures traversing a Mobius Strip in opposite directions and at various speeds, encountering different obstacles until they catch up with each other. Their separation is worsened by a reckless gambler who deceives the banished man into believing his Princess has betrayed him, even as she searches for him. Along the way there is a major subplot involving a long ago kidnapping of the King's two sons and the complication of a Roman invasion.

In part, the play is beloved of those who know it because it does all that Shakespeare does. It has everything. It starts with banishment and exile. It is about an intrepid young woman who dresses as a boy on a quest to find her lost love, by then a jealous husband. There is a sleeping potion that gives the appearance of death. There is a battle, single combat, and a beheading. There are rings and letters. We see dreams, ghosts, and a god. A comic gatekeeper appears, like Macbeth's porter or Hamlet's gravedigger. We witness regret, confession, forgiveness, mercy, redemption, and reunion. Characters communicate to the audience through monologues, soliloquies, and asides. It is a wonderful story that is beautifully told. We think that you will come to appreciate it and return to it for more careful readings.
