LAUREN LUNDGREN (Lighting Designer) is an arts abuser. She designs lights, sound, scenery and costumes. She writes, directs, stage-manages and studies for her M.A. in drama. Please, stop her before she creates again.

AUBREY McCLELLAN (The Judge) makes his first appearance at Live Oak Theatre. The El Cerrito resident last played Brasset in Where's Charley? at Contra Costa Civic Theatre. Earlier roles included Judge Gaffney in Harvey, a papa in Fiddler on the Roof, and Dr. Humphries in Life with Father. At the Masquers Theatre, he has portrayed Dr. Travers in Who's Life is it Anyway? plus four bit parts in Call Me Madam. Aubrey did 16 weeks as scientific host of Tempest in a Test Tube on KQED. He has often been a stage manager or, as here, assistant manager. He is the co-author of some 20 twenty scientific books, an avid collector of books and etchings of Venice, Italy, and plays Dixieland clarinet with the Riverboat Gamblers.

MICHAEL MOORE (Costume Designer) is working his second production with Actor's Ensemble, his first being Summer and Smoke. He is currently working on his Master's in Theatre Costume Design at the University of Michigan. Michael has worked on numerous productions all over the country, most recently as the Milliner on Eleanor at the Pittsburgh Public Theatre in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania.

ANDREA PRUSEAU (Mama Morton) was last seen at Actor's Ensemble as Grace Bassett in Summer and Smoke. At Summer Repertory Theatre she appeared as Dotty Otley in Noises Off, and Mrs. McGee in Corpse! Last summer she performed with Lamplighters Musical Theatre as Lady Grace Manley-Prowe in Something's Afoot.

DENNIS RATTO (Amos Hart) has been performing in theatre in the bay area since 1967 and *Chicago* marks his 46th production, although his first for Actor's Ensemble. SCOTT SLONE (Stage Manager) is once again backstage with AE. Chicago marks the second production with the Berkeley gang, the other being Mack and Mabel. Scott has been involved with theatre since high school, and has acted, stage-managed, designed, among other things, and had a general good time doing it. His fondest theatre memory is producing Best Little Whorehouse in Texas while being a cast member, prop finder, and set designer. Who could ask for more.

BREE SOLAND (Hunyak) has her first actual speaking part ("Not Guilty") in a musical with Chicago. She has had the fortune of studying jazz dance with Lynn Brilhante; and tap with such greats as Jimmy Slyde, Eddie Brown, and the late Joan Flint. Bree loves the art of dancing with great passion, and is looking for her sense of humor which she is sure she had but must have lost around here somewhere.

MELINDA L. THOMAS (Liz) has been visible throughout the local community theatre scene during the past several years. She has been the music director for such productions as Godspell, Grease, Pippin and West Side Story, as well as appearing onstage as Mrs. Cratchit in a musical version of A Christmas Carol and in the spoof Dracula: The Musical? Trained as a pianist, singer and vocal coach at the San Francisco Conservatory of Music and at San Francisco State University, she has been a member of the San Francisco Symphony Chorus and has accompanied numerous other musical productions. Roles such as Lina Lamont in Singing in the Rain, Adelaide in Guys and Dolls and Charity Hope Valentine in Sweet Charity have made her a favorite of the local musical stage, but her dramatic experience ranges from the work of Neil Simon to Jean Paul Sartre. Miss Turner holds a degree in Lyric Theatre from San Francisco State University. A California native, she is currently residing in the East Bay.

MICHAEL WEISS (Fred) recently performed at Live Oak Theatre as Francisco in the original production of *Work*. Originally from Marin County, he has been seen in a number of productions in the North Bay, including *The King and I*, South Pacific, My Fair Lady, The Fantasticks, and College of Marin's Amadeus.


