

DIRECTOR'S NOTES

Ron Berman says that "you have to see the humor, the absurdity of it all, to last in the emergency room. If you let the tragedies get to you, you couldn't function." E/R is a comedy about people who deal with life-and-death situations as part of their ordinary work day. An emergency room staff has an unusual opportunity to watch the human parade in full costume dress. In a single shift the E/R staff in this play treats an extraordinary assortment of patients for everything from hypochondria to heart disease. This show distills, in its two hours, all the warmth and cynicism, the absurdity and heroics, of the emergency room itself.

RONALD BERMAN, M.D., PLAYWRIGHT

When it comes to emergency room drama, Dr. Ronald Berman is a veteran. At the age of 42, Berman has 15 years experience in emergency rooms in inner-city and suburban hospitals, working as both an emergency physician and as director of emergency services.

A native of Chicago, Berman received his M.D. from the University of Illinois College of Medicine in 1971. During his residency in internal medicine at Illinois Masonic Hospital, he moonlighted as an emergency room physician and collected stories about emergency room life, which he shared with his old high school friend, Stuart Gordon. Gordon had become the artistic director of Chicago's Organic Theater, and he encouraged Berman to write a play based on his emergency room experiences.

Berman began collaborating on this project with Gordon and several actors from the Organic Theater. He then moved to northern California to take a position as director of emergency services at the Kaiser Foundation Hospital in Richmond. He would, however, fly back to Chicago on weekends and days off to work on the script and production of *E/R Emergency Room*, and in January 1982, the play opened to packed houses.

Then in 1983, E/R caught the attention of television producer Norman Lear and yet another collaboration began, this time on a new TV series. Berman worked as the medical adviser to the series, flying down to Los Angeles 2 days a week to work with the cast and crew, including the star Elliott Gould.

After 5 years of directing Kaiser Richmond's emergency room, Dr. Berman has moved on to an equally stressful position there. He is currently the chief of the department of internal medicine and lives in Berkeley with his wife, Susan, and daughter, Courtney.

JOHN RIBOVICH, DIRECTOR

John Ribovich is active in the Bay Area as a director, teacher and poet. He has worked with young actors for many years, building a successful drama program at a South Bay high school. He has studied directing with Albert Takazauckas at ACT and directed training videos for Hewlett-Packard.
