Nathan Robinson (Eddie) was last seen in Richard III with the Marin Shakespeare Festival. As a member of the Fourth Monkey Ensemble, he played the Clown in JB, Mack in Foolin' Around with Infinity, and he directed Sister Mary Ignatius Explains It All for You. Other roles include Leontes in The Winter's Tale, Scandal in Love for Love, Saul in True West and Hiram in The Normal Heart. He toured in the Lilliput Players' production of The Frog Prince. He has studied acting at ACT and at the Bennett Theatre Lab.

Jose Velasquez (Arty) has been studying for eight years, at ACT and the Idylwild School of Music and the Arts. His first professional theater experiences were in Cat on a Hot Tin Roof with ACT and Miriam's Flowers with Latin American Theatre Artists. He also sings and plays the string bass. This is his first time working with AE.

Donna Davis has directed comedies, dramas, musicals, and cabaret shows. Among them were the West Coast premiere of Joseph Heller's We Bombed in New Haven, and the world premiere of Jane Chamber's Kudzu, which received Drama Logue awards for directing and ensemble acting. She is also an award-winning actress, a member of Equity, SAG & AFTRA, a drama coach, and a communications consultant.

Director's Note

This play has all my favorite dramatic ingredients--clearly drawn characters, dynamic relationships, and transformations. At the start of the play, all of the characters seem to be "Lost in Yonkers", but as the story unfolds, we see that it is never too early and never too late for discovery, learning and growth. I think we will all remember these people for a long, long time.
